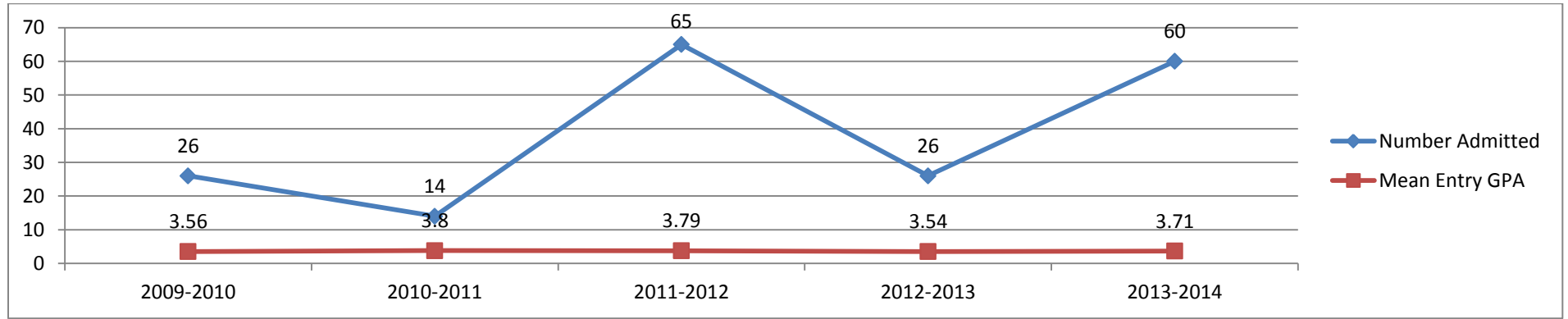

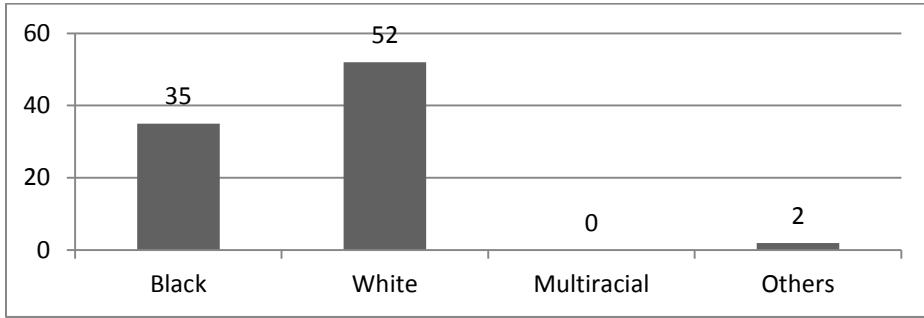

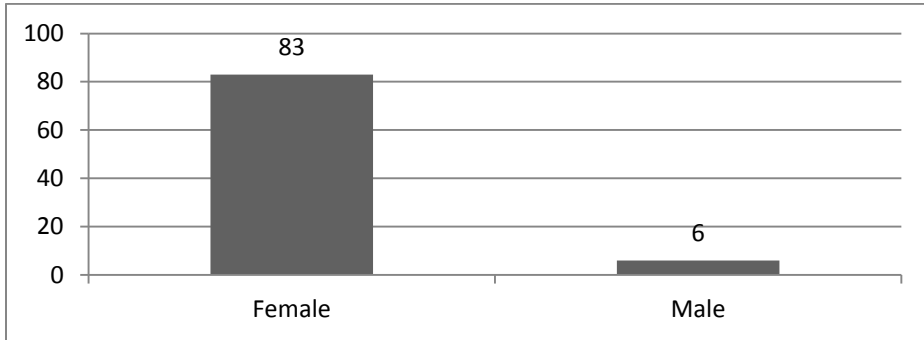

Race-Active Majors (N=89)*



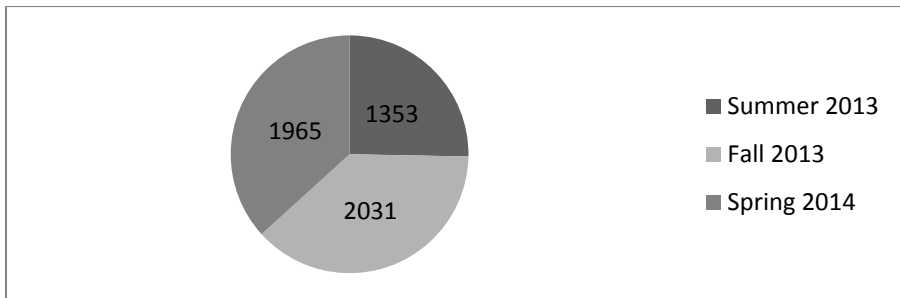

Credit Hour Production- All MEDT Graduate Courses (N=5349)*

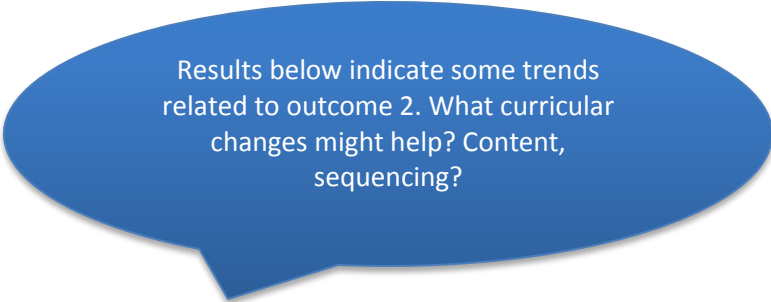
