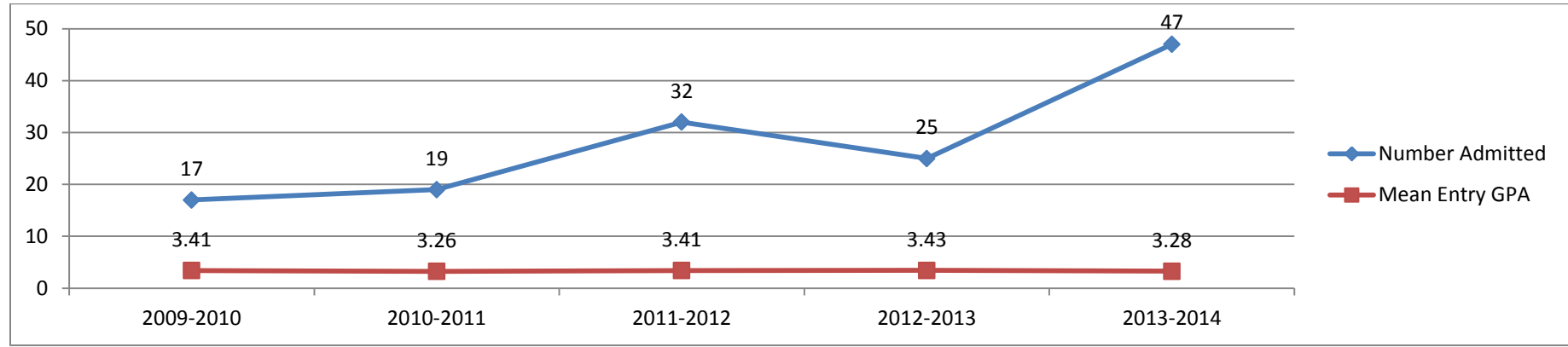

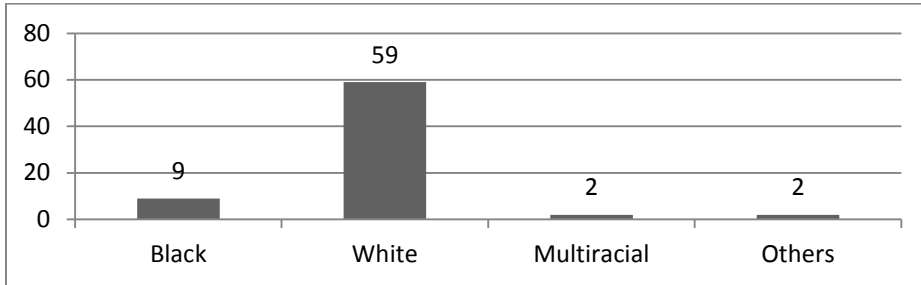

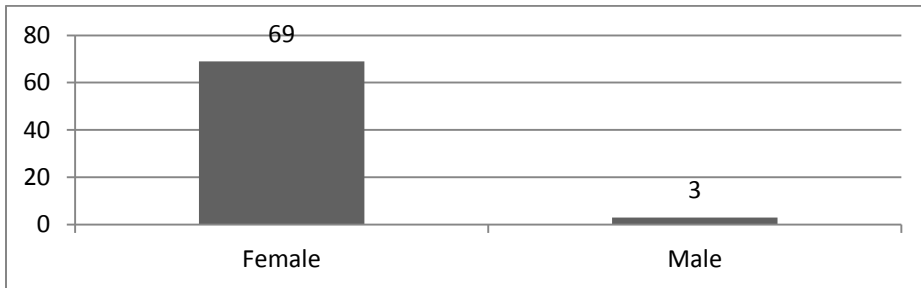

**Race-Active Majors (N=72)**



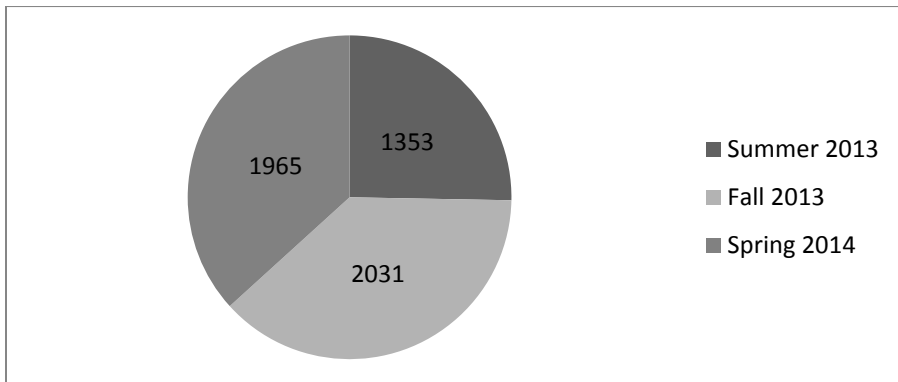
