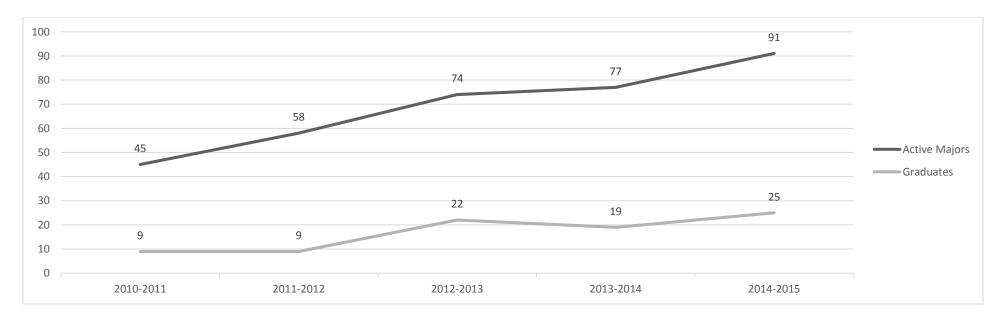

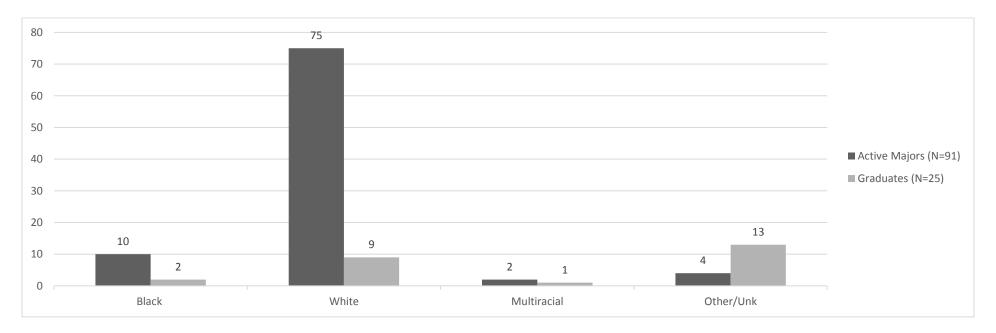

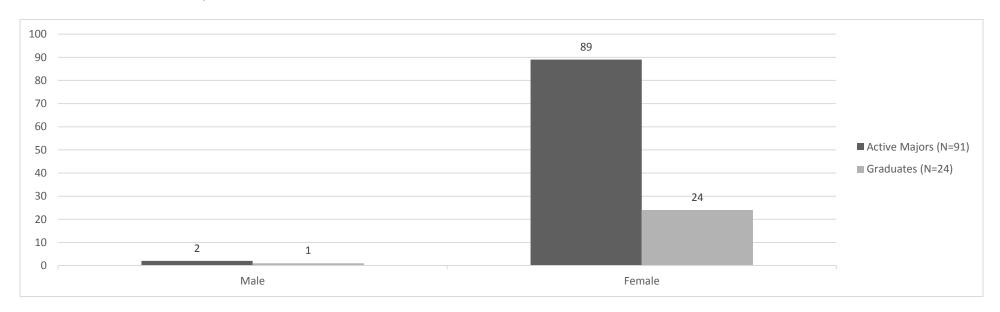
#### **Active Major & Graduate Trend Data**



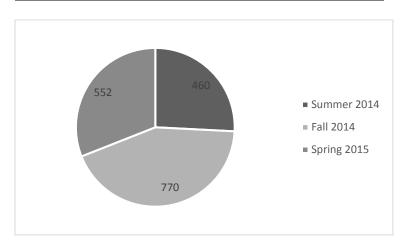
#### Race- 2014/2015 Active Majors and Graduates
